Foundation Director Chellee Nemec presented the Build Dakota Update. (see MRF #ST226). The Southeast Tech Foundation is in its third year of working with the Build Dakota Scholarship to provide highly motivated students that are interested in a skilled technical career with the tools, resources and opportunities necessary to successfully earn their degree and start a thriving career. Sponsor-A-Scholar matches individuals with companies that are willing to invest in their education and career. This support would encompass financial assistance for tuition as well as employment after graduation. Industry partners who sponsor a Build Dakota Scholar with half of the total college expenses can request funds from the Build Dakota Scholarship fund for the remaining expenses. Students that receive a Sponsor would be bound by the Build Dakota Scholarship requirements and any additional requirements arranged between them and their Sponsor. Southeast Tech will use the remaining Build Dakota Scholarship funds to offer additional scholarships. Industry would provide the student with a part-time internship (preferably paid). This year the Foundation is on track to increase the number of industry partnerships by 50% over last year.

Following general discussion, a motion was made by Todd Thoelke and seconded by Cynthia H. Mickelson, four (4) votes "yes" on roll call, **acknowledging the Build Dakota Update Report.**

Action ST00287

Director of Industry Relations Lon Hird presented the Apprenticeship Update Report. (see MRF #ST227) The Dental Assisting Apprenticeship is proposed for start-up in the Fall 2018 semester. This 1-year program will provide dentists in the region with a local source for qualified assistants. In the last six months, dentists have expressed frustration in finding qualified workers to fill assisting positions. This apprenticeship will help fill that void by using a combination of in-class, laboratory and on-the-job training models.

The Carpentry Pre-apprenticeship is being developed in partnership with the Associated General Contractors (AGC) and will help prepare high school students, 16 years of age and up, for entry into the construction industry or for additional construction industry education and training. This program, starting in the summer of 2018, will focus on the basic skills, processes and equipment used in residential and commercial construction. Student will receive classroom, laboratory and on-the-job instruction and training.

Following general discussion, a motion was made by Cynthia H. Mickelson and seconded by Todd Thoelke, four (4) votes "yes" on roll call, **acknowledging the Apprenticeship Update Report.**

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President Bob Griggs shared the South Dakota State Board of Technical Education will hold their March 27, 2018 board meeting at Southeast Tech. Southeast Tech will be hosting a private breakfast from 8:15 – 8:45 am prior to the 9:00 am board meeting.
