## Action ST00292

Marketing Instructors Kim Weihe and Brian Williams presented the Marketing Program Overview. (see MRF #ST230) The Marketing programs include the core Marketing program and emphases in either Sales or Marketing Design. These programs are all two year AAS Degrees and allow for flexibility for double-majoring with other Business Degrees. Southeast Tech Marketing graduates work in all industries – Health Care, Banking, Real Estate, Retail, Insurance, Hospitality and Manufacturing. They are Marketing Managers, Sales Managers, Account Executives, Business owners, Event Coordinators and Marketing Analysts.

## Action ST00293

Southeast Tech Vice President Tracy Noldner and CTE Principal Josh Hall presented the Citi Grant CTE Academy and Southeast Tech Partnership Report. (see MRF #ST231) Southeast Tech and the CTE Academy received a joint Citi Foundation Youth Workforce grant of \$250,000 in fall 2017. Fifteen nonprofit organizations across the U.S. received approximately \$4 million in grant funding with the grants expected to impact 5,000 youth across the country. The purpose of the grant is to specifically work with low income and other underprepared youth 16-24 to give them opportunities to explore and receive skilled training opportunities. Since receiving the grant, Southeast Tech and the CTE Academy have worked collaboratively to provide internships, shadowing experiences, career fairs, campus visits, camps, pre-apprenticeships, assessments, and other career exploration opportunities to Sioux Falls youth. Additionally, grant funds helped provide soft skill training to support student internship and work opportunities, as well as direct skilled training in specific areas, including CNA, CPR, and EMT. Future efforts include reaching out to those graduating high school students who have not at this time committed to receiving additional skilled training upon graduation in order to provide them with the options and opportunities available for completing skilled training that can lead to rewarding careers.

## Action ST00294

Lon Hird, Director of Industry Relations, presented the SkillsUSA Conference and Competition update. (see MRF #ST232) Southeast Tech will be hosting the 2018 South Dakota State SkillsUSA Conference and Competition on April 12 and 13, 2018. Competitors will come from across South Dakota. Students will compete in over 40 different competition categories. Represented will be all four technical institutes and eleven high schools with over 270 students registered for competitions.
