Dual Credit Update
EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Purpose:

To provide the School Board an overview of the Dual Credit program at Southeast Tech.

The Dual Credit program has become a very popular program at Southeast Tech. High school students can take college courses to be used for both high school and college credit for a cost of only \$40 per credit. Many New Tech and CTE High School students have been able to take courses at no cost. The \$40 per credit has been paid by a grant from the “Tech Ed Works” initiative. Southeast Tech receives additional reimbursement from the state of South Dakota at a reduced rate.

Only a handful of students took Dual Credit classes prior to 2014 since most students paid full-price. During the 2014 school year 223 students (446 duplicated head count) from 45 different school district’s took courses in the last school year. These students contributed 1366 credits to our overall credit count.

There was no statistical difference between the academic performance of our Dual Credit students vs. our regular degree seeking students.

Administrative Recommendation to School Board:

Acknowledge the Dual Credit program and accept the status update.

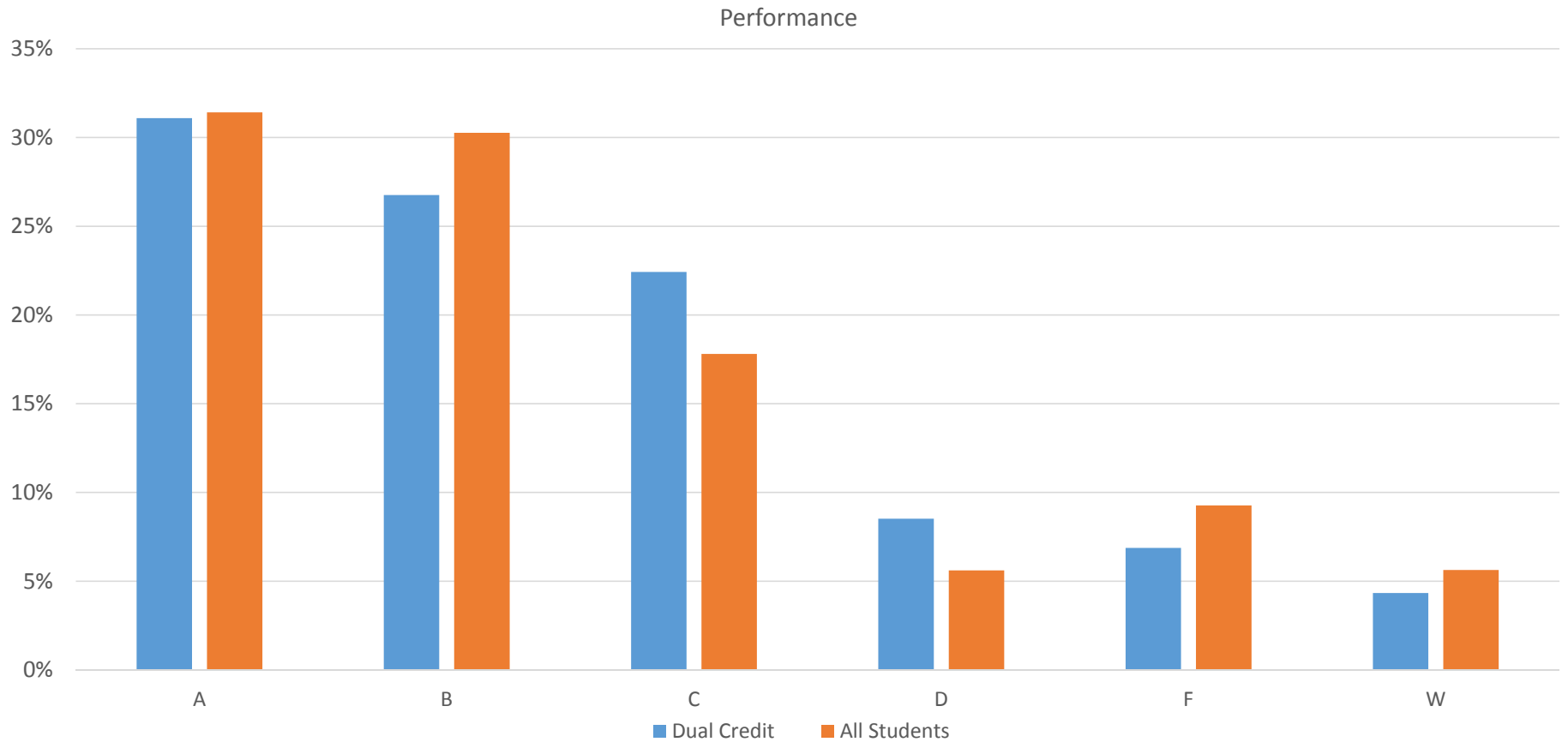
