ONE PROGRAM, MULTIPLE WAYS TO BUILD YOUR WORKFORCE

SPONSOR A SCHOLAR: 50/50 BUILD DAKOTA

Industry partners who sponsor a Build Dakota Scholar with half of the total college expenses can request funds from the Build Dakota Scholarship to fund the remaining expenses. Students that receive a Sponsor would be bound by the Build Dakota Scholarship requirements and any additional requirements arranged between them and their sponsor. Southeast Tech will use the remaining Build Dakota Scholarship dollars to offer additional scholarships to other students.

Sponsor A Scholar: 50/50 Build Dakota is a great way to leverage Build Dakota funds to grow your workforce. Companies can use this program to "grow their own" by up-skilling their current workforce or using their network of employees to identify a student that they would be willing to sponsor to enroll at Southeast Tech. Industry partners have the option to offer the student an employment agreement in exchange for their investment into the student's education.

FORWARD SIOUX FALLS BUILD DAKOTA GRANT

The Forward Sioux Falls Build Dakota Grant would offer members of The Sioux Falls Area Chamber of Commerce, Forward Sioux Falls, and The Sioux Falls Development Foundation the opportunity to apply for a grant that would offset one third of the industry investment into the Sponsor A Scholar 50/50 Build Dakota Match program at Southeast Tech.



ONE PROGRAM, MULTIPLE WAYS TO BUILD YOUR WORKFORCE

SPONSOR A CTE SCHOLAR

Southeast Tech and The Career and Technical Education Academy (CTE Academy) have partnered together to create a pathway for a high school senior to continue their education in a high need work area with the support of an industry partner.

Sponsor A CTE Scholar is a \$7,000-\$10,000 investment from an industry partner, depending on the program the student chooses to enter. Of the industry partner investment, \$3,000 would offset the cost of tuition at CTE Academy or cover the cost of the student to participate in their internship program with the sponsoring company. The remaining investment would be used to leverage Build Dakota scholarship dollars to give the student a full ride scholarship at Southeast Tech. Industry partners have the option to offer the student an employment agreement in exchange for their investment into the student's education. Sponsor A CTE Scholar gives industry partners the opportunity to reach students early on in their education, develop their interest and skills in a technical field, and complete their education at Southeast Tech.



ONE PROGRAM, MULTIPLE WAYS TO BUILD YOUR WORKFORCE

SPONSOR A SCHOLAR

Industry partners can Sponsor a Scholar that did not receive a Build Dakota Scholarship for a \$5,000 investment. The first \$1,000 will create a scholarship through the Southeast Tech Foundation for a student.* The remaining \$4,000 will be invested in a student chosen by the sponsoring company. Industry would provide the student with a parttime internship (preferably paid).

As a company supporter in the Sponsor a Scholar program, Southeast Tech will facilitate cultivation events in which companies will get one-on-one time with students. Southeast Tech will also provide the company a packet of information that will engage them and the student in an after-graduation agreement that outlines their opportunity for employment with the company in return for the company sponsorship of their education.

*Company would not designate recipient of the scholarship but would choose the student they wish to sponsor.

14 Companies participated in Sponsor A Scholar (Option B) Scholarships: \$14,000 Sponsorship: \$38,000

Forward Sioux Falls: \$50,000 for 5 years

Sanford Health: \$200,000 (30 LPN Students)

2017 Potential Sponsorship: \$295,000

2017 Current Total Sponsorship: \$288,000

2017 Total Potential Sponsorship: \$583,000
