


Make a fruit smoothie!

- celebrates the experience of discovery has unique outcomes with no two pieces looking alike

Product Art...

- is adult driven
- offers the child clear steps that have to be followed
- has a specific outcome in mind
- expects the final product to look like a sample
- has expectations around a right and wrong way to do it




Family Friday
